Type: Note **Notes:** This week we look at the place of freedom in feminist thought as well as feminist critiques of various theories of freedom. Achieving freedom for women is often characterised as the central goal of feminism. Feminists have, however, often criticised inherited theories of freedom, especially liberal ones, for leaving women unfree in the private sphere.
